Methodology Elements

- 1. Elaboration of common definitions
- 2. Data collection and analysis
- 3. Identification common topics

- 5. Pilot phase





1. Elaboration of common definitions

- e.g. "Major Event"
 - Historical, political significance or popularity
 - Large media coverage and/or international media attendance
 - Participation of citizens from different countries and/or possible target groups
 - Participation of VIPs and/or dignitaries
 - High number of persons
- Shared by all partners
- Innovative at EU level
- Extension to EU-SEC II Partners & European Council





2. Data collection and analysis

Survey on the state of the art of national research programmes

- Security Plans
- Threats and vulnerabilities
- National Research Programmes on Major Events





3. Identification of common topics

- Definition of concrete research topics of operational use for the project partners:
 - 1) Definition of relevant areas to explore e.g.
 - Development of an International best police practices
 - Technology development
 - Evaluation and information sharing...
 - 2) 5 NY's ideas
 - Common Pool of Available Specialist Technical Equipment (STEP)
 - Common Register of Major Events in Europe (EMER)

- Networking systems
- Best practice in coordination of national resources
